

### The Cost of Freedom

John Adams, in a letter to his wife Abigail dated July 3, 1776, wrote, "I am well aware of the toil and blood and treasure, that it will cost us to maintain this Declaration, and support and defend these States. Yet through all the gloom I can see the rays of ravishing light and glory." He knew that simply declaring independence from Britain would not make it so. This is still the case today. I wonder if Americans will see the same light and glory through all the gloom we see today. Are we Americans ready to pay the cost of toil, blood, and treasure for the freedom and liberty many died for?

We are born slaves to sin and helpless to free ourselves. Jesus has already paid the cost of spiritual freedom from sin, death, and the devil. He paid the ransom for all sins and redeemed us from slavery through His innocent suffering and death. His sacrifice once for all is large enough for all sin, and all people can be free. His resurrection is proof of this redemption. The Holy Spirit works in our hearts and minds, faith in Christ and His Word. He creates and sustains that faith.

Christians understand this concept of cost to maintain the truth and love of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. St. Peter says in 1 Peter 1:6-7, "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. These have come so that your faith — of greater worth than gold, which perishes even though refined by fire — may be proved genuine and may result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed." Christians have paid and are still today paying the cost with toil, blood, and treasure. While we may not have faced the kind of deadly persecution other Christians face, we are ready to pay the cost with our lives. The work we do and the money we give supports the cause of freedom. We stand with Christ on the side of the freedom of the Gospel.

Too many people remain in slavery to sin; and other people have abused their freedom and again find themselves on the wrong side. We must fight for their freedom by being examples of Christ to the world and standing firm in our faith in God and His Word. The only hope for a world caught in sin is to show the love of Christ and proclaim God's Word of Law and Gospel. We are beacons of liberty from sin, and we will remain faithful to this cause no matter the cost.

### Christian Senior Ministries

Christian Senior Ministries brings the Gospel of Jesus Christ to those who are no longer in their own home but now reside in a nursing home, assisted living facility, senior housing, or special needs housing (in DeKalb and Ogle counties). Christian Senior Ministries is a recognized service organization (RSO) of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. Pastor Timothy Frick visits the Rochelle sites. Marcy covers the first Thursdays of the month for Pastor Frick.

This ministry offers services like worship services, Bible studies, one-on-one visits, and opportunities for Christian fellowship, all aimed at bringing the Gospel to those who may not be able to attend regular church services.

# Key aspects of Christian Senior Ministries as an LCMS RSO:

**Focus on Senior Care:** The ministry specifically targets individuals in senior living facilities, addressing their unique needs and challenges

### **Gospel-Centered:**

The core of the ministry is to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ through worship, Bible studies, and personal interaction.

### **LCMS Affiliation:**

As an RSO, it operates independently but is recognized by the LCMS and aligns with its mission and doctrine.

### Partnering with Congregations:

Christian Senior Ministries collaborates with St. John Lutheran Church in Sycamore, IL, demonstrating how RSOs work with local congregations to extend their reach.

The health letter this month was written by Maggie Niemi. Maggie has been part of the parish nurse team for several years and has served in many ways. Most recently she has been assisting with some nursing home or homebound visits, coordinating the "Blue Christmas" Grief Event, and assisting with various needs.

### **Protecting Our Skin: A Gift from God**

Our skin is a remarkable creation—our body's largest organ, designed by God to protect us from harm. Just as we care for our hearts and minds, we must also nurture our skin, ensuring it remains healthy and strong.

### **Biblical Wisdom on Caring for Our Bodies**

The Bible reminds us that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit:

"Do you not know that your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit, who is in you, whom you have received from God? You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your bodies." — I Corinthians 6:19-20

By caring for our skin, we honor God's creation and show gratitude for the life He has given us.

### **Practical Tips for Skin Health**

- **Protect Against the Sun:** Excessive sun exposure can lead to damage. Use sunscreen, wear protective clothing, and seek shade when needed.
- **Stay Hydrated:** Drinking plenty of water keeps our skin nourished and healthy.
- **Maintain a Healthy Diet:** Foods rich in vitamins and antioxidants support skin health.
- **Practice Kindness to Yourself:** Our worth is not defined by appearance.

### **Skin Inspection for Tick and Mosquito Bites**

Ticks and mosquitoes can carry infections that affect our health. Regular skin checks can help detect early signs of infection and prevent complications.

Tick Bites: After spending time outdoors, especially in wooded or grassy areas, inspect your skin for ticks. If a tick is attached, removing it properly is crucial. A credit cardstyle tick remover is often more effective than tweezers, as it minimizes the risk of squeezing the tick's body, which could release harmful bacteria into the bite area. These flat, wallet-sized tick removal cards have a V-shaped notch that allows for a smooth sliding motion, lifting the tick out without twisting or crushing it. This method helps ensure a clean removal, reducing chance of infection. After removal, disinfect the area and watch for signs such as redness, swelling, or a rash expanding outward (a possible sign of Lyme disease).

Mosquito Bites: While most mosquito bites are harmless, some can transmit diseases. If a bite becomes excessively red, swollen, or warm to the touch, it may be infected. Scratching increases the risk of infection, so avoid excessive irritation and apply antiseptic ointment if needed.

### **Healing and Restoration**

God's love extends to healing and renewal. His promise: "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." – Psalm 147:3

Let us care for our skin with the same love and attention we give to our spiritual well-being. May we honor God by protecting and nurturing the bodies He has entrusted to us.

### DeKalb Community Hosts Annual Aruna Run on July 26 to Help Free Sexually Exploited Women in India

**DeKalb, IL** — Local supporters of The Aruna Project, an international nonprofit working to free, employ, and empower victims of human sex trafficking, will host their 3rd annual 5K and 1-Mile fun run/walk in DeKalb on **Saturday, July 26, 2025**, at **Christ Community Church**, located at 2350 Pride Avenue. This inspiring and family-friendly event supports the Aruna Project's mission to create lifelong freedom for women trapped in exploitation—providing them with trauma-informed care, safe housing, and meaningful employment.

Over the past two years, the DeKalb Aruna Run has raised more than \$58,000, directly benefiting survivors of human trafficking. The DeKalb event is one of several held across the country to raise both awareness and funding for the Aruna Project's life-changing work.

Ryan Berg, Founder and CEO of the Aruna Project, emphasized the urgent need for action. Since 2015, the organization has cared for over **8,400 women**, freed and employed more than **160 survivors**, and prevented over **560 women and children** from being trafficked.


