I want to thank everyone for your prayers and support during the time I had some health issues. I was at a point that I did not know if I could continue to serve St. Paul as your vacancy pastor. On Sunday, July 13, I felt very low and then the next day I felt a whole lot better. I thank God for minor miracles and His mercy and grace. I often say that the devil knocks me down and the Lord lifts me up. As I write this, I am scheduled for a kidney transplant on July 29. I will be recovering for 4-6 weeks. We will find pastors to fill in for me. I am willing to serve after my recovery, so pray for me. Your love and support mean a lot to me.

Now we are again in search for a full-time pastor. we must be patient and wait on the Lord to give us the right pastor at the right time. This means we are going to have to step up our effort. Since, I have seen the power of prayer. St, James says in James 5:16, "The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working." I am thinking that maybe St. Paul can start a prayer chain. Prayer is so important. It can keep us updated on the needs of our people. I would also like us to put as much effort into our youth and family ministry as we do in our senior ministry. I am also thankful for the work of our in-reach/outreach committee. If we want a strong church ministry, then we all need to see what we can do. Ask the leaders what you can do to help.

I also would like to invite you to join me in Bible study on Sunday mornings at 10:15 am. We read in Hebrews 4:12, "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart." When we gather, we are able to see the living and active word of God in our lives. It gives us time to think and go deeper into the Gospel and its meaning for our daily walk with Christ. The Holy Spirit has made us alive in Christ. It is He who made the sacrifice for sin and rose from the dead to secure us life with God now and forever. See what you can do to continue to be in the Word and active in your faith.

The Parish Nurse's Notes:

Dear St. Paul Family and Friends,

As I write this health letter, we have been experiencing several days with eat advisories and frequently given or received advise to "drink plenty of water". Water is, indeed, needed for our physical and spiritual wellness. Ordinary water provides for our ordinary wellness. Living water is needed for our spiritual wellness.

Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." John 7:38 It is important to be able to differentiate a heat stroke from heat exhaustion. Heat exhaustion happens when your body loses excess amounts of water and salt, usually from sweating. Heat stroke is a serious medical emergency that happens when your body is not able to control its internal temperature.

Both heat stroke and heat exhaustion are caused by your body's inability to cool itself. Your body's natural way for cooling is by sweating. During strenuous work or exercise in hot weather your body may not be able to sweat enough to keep you cool--hence, the advice to drink plenty of water.

Other causes of heat exhaustion and heat stroke include dehydration (related to any reason), wearing heavier or tight clothing, or consuming alcohol.

Heat exhaustion can lead to heat stroke if it continues for an extended period of time. Heat stroke can come on quickly if it is very hot or you overexert yourself. It is important to begin treatment at the first signs of heat exhaustion.

If you can cool down within 30 minutes, heat exhaustion is not usually considered an emergency. If any of the following symptoms exist, call 911 and seek immediate medical attention: body temperature above 104F, confusion, loss of consciousness, not sweating (even though you feel hot), shortness of breath, fast breathing, excessive nausea or vomiting, or seizure.

Heat stroke can be much more serious than heat exhaustion and requires immediate medical attention. A helpful guide has been developed and made available on the bulletin board in the back of the sanctuary. Help yourself and keep it handy.

If you are at church and feel heat exhaustion, remember: (1) There is always a supply of water in the refrigerator in the overflow room. (2) window AC is available in the offices, towels that can be made wet and aid your comfort are in the coffee bar.
