### DISCIPLINE

I am thankful to God for this wonderful gift of a new lease on life. It was truly a miracle. I met my old nephrologist, kidney doctor, who thought that I would never receive a transplant. He said by the time I was eligible to get one I would be too old and not in good shape. He said his prognosis would be the same if he saw me today. He couldn't believe that I got a kidney from an anonymous living donor. It was against all science. I said that this is what a miracle looks like. I didn't deserve it, but it was a gift of God's grace. I want to thank you for all your prayers, cards, and messages during my recovery. I guess you never know how much you are loved until you are in need. I got messages and cards from all my old churches who were kind enough to reach out to me. I am greatly humbled by all your love.

My recovery has been difficult with many different health issues. At times I felt very depressed and unable to do anything. I had my doubts and worries along with the pain. I felt like Job at times. The Epistle reading for Sunday really hit home for me and I heard God talking to me. Hebrews 12:5-6 quotes Proverbs 3:11-12, "My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. For the Lord disciplines the one he loves and chastises every son whom he receives." As I look back on my troubles and pain, I now realize the Lord did love me and always will. We must never think that God doesn't love us or abandoned us, because of what Christ did for us on the cross. God sacrificed His own Son for us that we might now become the children of God which is who we are.

I also remember Hebrews says in verse 11, "For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it." It has yield peace and righteousness in my soul. I am a sinner like all people and can fall prey to Satan's traps, but as I have often said, the devil knocks me down, but the Lord lifts me up. In whatever trials and trouble may come our way; God will lift us up with His love and strength and give us peace and righteousness during those tough times. A Recognized Service Organization of the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, Voice of Care trains church workers and lay volunteers to serve in five types of disability ministry: Congregational Life, Disability Awareness, Facility Ministry, Outdoor Ministry and REST (Respite Education and Support Tools). # The Parish Nurse's Notes:

Dear St. Paul Family and Friends,

Does the Bible say anything about lice? Some say that the 3<sup>rd</sup> plague to the Egyptians (Exodus 8:16-18) was lice; others call these pesty little critters fleas or gnats. Either way, these small insects or parasites are a pesty nuisance today.

September has sometimes been called "national pediculosis awareness month" because there seems to be an increase when children return to school. Pediculosis capitis is the kind of louse



found in the hair. *Pediculosis humanus (or sometimes called P corpus)* is the type of louse found on the human body.

The life cycle of the louse begins with the **nits** (eggs). They are hard to see and are often confused with dandruff or drops of hair spray. The nits are laid by the adult female and cemented to the base of th4e hair shaft. If you can brush it away, it is not a nit. Nits are very small and usually yellow or white. They take about a week to hatch.

The egg hatches and releases a **nymph**. The nit shell becomes more visible and about the size of a pinhead. Nymphs become adults about 7 days after hatching.

The **adult** louse is about the size of a sesame seed, has six legs (each with claws), and is tan to grayish-white. Females are usually larger than males and can lay up to 8 nits a day. Adult lice can live up to 30 days on a person's head. To live, they feed on blood several times daily.

The majority of head lice infestations are asymptomatic. When symptoms are present, there is a tickling sensation in the head, itching, and sometimes an allergic reaction.

**The main mode of transmission** is by personal contact. This can be through sharing hats, scarves, combs, towels, pillows, or similar items.

Pediculosis is called a nuisance disease because it is more irritating than serious. It is highly contagious and very difficult to get rid of. Numerous over the counter products are available to use as a shampoo. If you have further questions about management of lice, feel free to check with me in the parish nurse office.

Day is scheduled for October 31st. We are so glad that we can hold this great event. Mark your calendars.


I would like to thank Don Kosterman and Lee Metzger for mowing of the church and school lawn. It is a huge job and it has been a wonderful bless-


