

While our lives change, the Word of God doesn't. Jesus came to fulfill God's mercy and grace as promised in the Old Testament. As the Lamb of God, He came to fulfill all of the sacrifices made for sin beforehand. He sacrificed Himself for the sins of all the world from Adam to the last person alive when He comes the second time as the Judge and Savior in all of His power and glory. However, it has been said that there are three comings of Christ, first as a human being, the final at the end of time, and the time Jesus comes to us and makes us His people. The first and last coming of Jesus Christ mean nothing without Him coming to us in faith. Jesus came to us in Baptism where the Holy Spirit recreated us into the image of Christ. He comes to us in the Word and Holy Communion. He comes to us as we seek to serve Him by loving others as Christ loved us. The Parish Nurse's Notes:

Dear St. Paul Family and Friends,

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands.... I John 1:1

Have you ever really thought about everything you have touched with your hands? Have you ever intentionally held hands with anyone to show comfort, to welcome them, to seal a deal, or let the other person know you care? If you have ever visited a long-term care facility, you probably encountered several people reaching out for your touch as you passed their way. The well-known Romanian orphanage study of 1989 identified the correlation between lack of touch and Failure to Thrive. Many NICUs now have volunteers to spend time cuddling the infants. These are all good things! Hallmark said it best, "reach out and touch someone."

Nevertheless, touching others with our hands can be a bad thing when we do not keep our hands clean. You might mean the touch in a good way—but it turned out bad because you shared some germs and the person became ill. This is especially true when someone is very weak and not able to fight off the germs you share.



Good handwashing is the single most important thing we can do to prevent infectious illnesses in ourselves and others. Regular handwashing can help control the spread of respiratory illnesses, diarrhea, and other contract or airborne infections.

The Center for Disease Prevention recommends the following handwashing technique:

- * Wet hands using clean, warm or cold running water to wet your hands.
- * Turn off the tap and apply soap to your hands.
- * Rub your hands together to create lather, scrubbing every surface of your hands for at least 20 seconds. This is a good time to sing or hum the "Happy Birthday" song twice or "Jesus Loves Me" once.
- * Rinse your hands under clean, running water. (Use your elbow or a towel to turn the water on and off.
- * Dry your hands using a clean towel or air dryer. Use a towel to open the door to exit the restroom.

Children learn good handwashing from their role models. Adults are role models. Are you using the correct handwashing technique? The parish nurse office has some "fake germs" and a glow light that is a fun way to test your skills. Children or adults—if you want to practice, stop in the parish nurse office and practice or just enjoy the experience.

Donations for the Parish Nursing/Medical Clinics Initiative in Ethiopia need to be in by December 15th so that appropriate inventories for the customs review in Ethiopia can be completed prior to our trip. Marcy and a team of five other LCMS parish nurses, a deaconess from Lutheran Church Charities, and a few supporters will leave January 3 for Ethiopia. Marcy and the parish nurses will be teaching a parish nurse course for 50 parish nurse coordinators (1 for each synod/district) of the Lutheran Church in Ethiopia (Mekene Yesus). Donated medical supplies will be used to set up small clinics in the 50 parish nurse sites—and other rural clinics.

Maggie Niemi and others on the parish nurse team at St. Paul will be available to cover for Marcy during her absence (January 3-19).

Community Outreach to Senior Living Sites: Christian Senior Ministry to Liberty Village and Hawthorne Inn are in a state of transition due to the retirement of Pastor Frick. Our regular outreach will be on hold pending their search to replace Pastor Frick. Once their new schedule is set, we will know the day and time of our outreach. This change does not affect the outreach to Lincoln Manor. The December devotion and fellowship will be **December 4 at 2pm**.



The annual Christmas gifts to the nursing home residents will be prepared and delivered between December 4-6 with the following schedule: December 4 (9am-?) inventory all donations and shopping as needed and December 5 (9am-?) sort items and prepare for packaging (a few volunteers would be appreciated). **December 6 (9am-?) packing gift boxes and delivering to nursing homes. Several volunteers needed....with sufficient volunteers the task is completed in a couple of hours.**

Board for Health and Human Care will meet at 8am (Saturday, Dec. 6th) prior to the gift packing.

OK Club will meet on Friday, December 12th at noon at church with lunch from Jimmy Johns. After a brief devotion, the group will pack the cheer boxes for the members of our family of faith who are known to be homebound or otherwise experiencing a difficulty.



Thursday Worship and Fellowship will be **Thursday, December 18th at 2:15pm.** **NOTE THE DATE change due to Christmas.**

This service is specifically planned for those whose health needs make attending weekend worship difficult.

Pastor Gudgel will be providing an abbreviated service with communion. Marcy will be available to assist with any health needs and to provide some refreshments following the service. If you need assistance with transportation, please contact Marcy or the church office a couple of days in advance and every effort will be made to obtain a ride for you.


