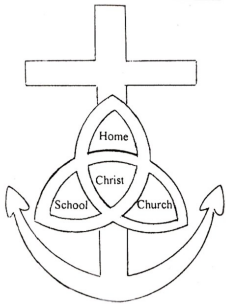

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Chuck Feeney became a billionaire in secret and spent 30 years giving away his wealth with almost no public recognition. Feeney co-founded Duty Free Shoppers in 1960 and struck it rich. By the early 1980's, the multi-billionaire grew uncomfortable with the opulent life of yachts and mansions. In 1982, Feeney started The Atlantic Philanthropies and quietly transferred his entire stake of the company – worth billions – to the foundation. For the next 15 years, his identity as a massive benefactor remained secret. He rejected public recognition, and many charitable organizations received millions of dollars with no idea of where the funds originated. Over the course of his lifetime, Chuck Feeney gave away 99% of his wealth, more than \$8 billion!

Feeney gives a little glimpse of Jesus. The Most Massive Benefactor loves to give gifts to you with the best one being Himself. Chuck Feeney donated generous gifts in a way that was not flashy but quiet and subtle, while Christ gives far better gifts in a way that is not flashy at all. A little bread. A sip of wine. To the eyes of an atheist, it doesn't appear to be much at all. But through the eyes of faith, you can see what is contained therein – the King of Kings, the Lord of Lord, the Savior of Humanity.

I appreciate how St. Paul Lutheran Church has a tradition of making God's gift of Communion available every week. (One weekend it's on Sunday and the next is on Saturday, and back and forth it goes.) Every week, you can receive a gift worth infinitely more than a million or two. Every week, you can receive His body and blood, given and shed for you for the forgiveness of your sins!

Now, the elders and I want to make it even easier for you to be blessed with this priceless gift. Here's the plan: Every service, every weekend. Free gifts. Free Jesus. True body. True blood. Washed clean in a most personal way. Touched by the Savior. He literally puts Himself in you because He loves you.

This plan will be implemented soon, and it will require two things. (1) We will need more volunteers to help with Communion setup. Knowing the number of faithful people we have in this church, it shouldn't be an issue! Please contact Julie in the church office to let her know about your desire to serve the Lord in this way. (2) We will need spiritual discipline. If a philanthropist gave you \$1,000 every week, you might eventually take that gift for granted. The gift of Christ's body and blood can also be taken for granted so we need to be disciplined in our preparation: Praying ahead of time, examining ourselves, and – after receiving – thanking God for a gift so great all the world's money could not buy it.

What a joy it will be to receive, even more often, the priceless gift of Christ in Communion!

The Parish Nurse's Notes:

Walking in the Light During Winter's Darker Days

Faith, Scripture, and Healthy Choices for the Winter Season



As winter settles in and daylight grows scarce, many people experience what is often called the “winter blues.” Shorter days, cold temperatures, and less time outdoors can affect our mood, energy, and sense of well-being. While these challenges are real, God’s Word reminds us that His light is never diminished—even when the sun seems hidden.

“The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.” — John 1:5 (ESV)

God’s Light and Our Daily Lives

As Christians, we are comforted by the truth that Christ is our true Light. Yet God also calls us to care for our bodies, which He has created and redeemed.

“Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you...? Therefore glorify God in your body.”

— 1 Corinthians 6:19–20

Caring for body and soul goes hand in hand, especially during winter when our routines change and our spirits may feel weighed down.

Healthy Habits That Support Well-Being in Winter

While nothing replaces prayer, worship, and time in God’s Word, simple daily practices can help support emotional and physical health during darker months:

1. Seek Light When Possible

Natural sunlight helps regulate our internal rhythms. Opening curtains during the day, sitting near windows, or spending time outdoors—even briefly—can be beneficial. When sunlight is limited, keeping living spaces well-lit can also help.

“For with You is the fountain of life; in Your light do we see light.”

— Psalm 36:9

2. Maintain Movement

Gentle exercise, such as walking, stretching, or light household activity, can lift energy and mood. Movement is a way to steward the body God has given us. *“Let us not grow weary of doing good...”* — Galatians 6:9

3. Nourish the Body Well

Balanced meals, warm soups, whole foods, and adequate hydration can help sustain energy levels. Eating regularly and wisely is one way we honor God’s provision.

4. Stay Connected in Christian Community

Isolation can deepen feelings of sadness. Attending worship, Bible study, or simply checking in with fellow members reflects the body of Christ caring for one another.

“Therefore encourage one another and build one another up.”

— 1 Thessalonians 5:11

5. Rest and Routine

Winter often disrupts sleep patterns. Consistent bedtimes, restful evenings, and moments of quiet prayer can bring both physical rest and spiritual peace.

When the Blues Feel Heavy

If feelings of sadness, fatigue, or hopelessness persist, it is wise to speak with a trusted pastor, Christian counselor, or healthcare professional. Seeking help is not a sign of weak faith, but of faithful stewardship.

“Cast all your anxieties on Him, because He cares for you.” — 1 Peter 5:7

Living in Hope

Even in winter’s darkness, God is at work. The seasons remind us that change comes in God’s time, and the promise of light remains sure.

“The Lord is my light and my salvation—whom shall I fear?” — Psalm 27:1

May this winter be a time of drawing closer to Christ, caring for one another, and trusting that the Light of the world walks with us every day.

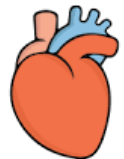

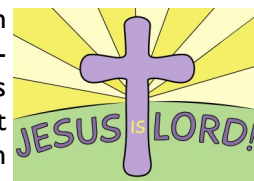

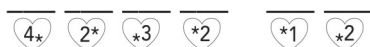
