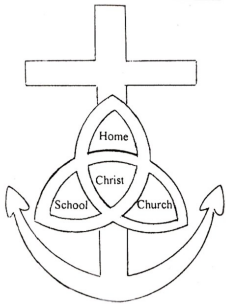

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As I sit down to write my first letter, I think about roots. Deep roots. A healthy plant, deeply rooted below the surface, can bear abundant fruit above the surface. A healthy Christian, deeply rooted in grace and truth, can bear abundantly the Spirit's fruit of, "love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control" (Galatians 5:22-23).

I look forward to getting to know all of you. You will quickly discover that I am a curious person who asks many questions. I like to listen and look forward to listening to your story. Your problems. Your pain. Your joys. Your sorrows. Your hopes and dreams for the future.

My hope and dream for the future is that St. Paul becomes known more and more as a caring community of Christians, deeply rooted in grace and truth. John 1:17 states, "For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." Grace – God's undeserved love – is what we receive for the sake of Christ crucified and what we share with one another. (I will make many mistakes and ask for grace along the way. I ask you to give it freely, and I will do the same.)

Let us strive to be deeply rooted in God's grace and in His truth. The world around us is crying out for something substantive and lasting, something reverent and eternal, something that does not change continually (like the weather in Northern Illinois). So, come to worship weekly. Attend Bible Study frequently. Dig deeper into the Word of God. Learn to love the hidden treasure of Lutheran theology. (It is the best exposition of grace and truth.) That is what the world needs and what we need.

Let us strive to grow together, becoming deeply rooted in grace and truth. The fruit will be evident with joyful bundles of blessings rippling out into our church, school, families, and the people of Rochelle.

During her absence Maggie Niemi will be the primary contact person if you need a parish nurse. Maggie teaches full time at Rockford Career College, so may not be immediately available. Please call her (815-677-6600) and leave a message. She will respond as soon as possible. If you need something quicker, please call Julie Dilling (815-562-274) in the church office. She will do her best to locate one of the other nurses on the parish nurse team.

Marcy will resume her usual hours on Wednesday, January 21 (8:00-11:30). She will be home late Monday and Tuesday but catching up on some well needed sleep. If you have an urgent need, you may contact her at home (815-562-6823).

REMINDER: The NID Parish Nurse Network is planning a short trip for seniors to Mission Central in Mapleton, IA and a few other stops along the way. The trip is planned for August 3-6—and an estimate of the number of participants is needed by **February 14th** to determine the cost which is based on number of participants. This is not a fundraiser, but we do need to charge for the cost of transportation and lodging with breakfasts. There is no cost to visit Mission Central. **The trip is senior friendly with minimal walking, frequent rest breaks, and a reasonable cost.** The actual costs will be determined soon after the travel agent (AAA) receives the estimated numbers. 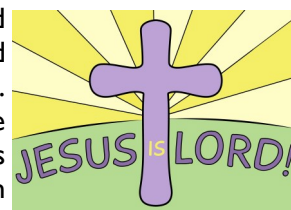

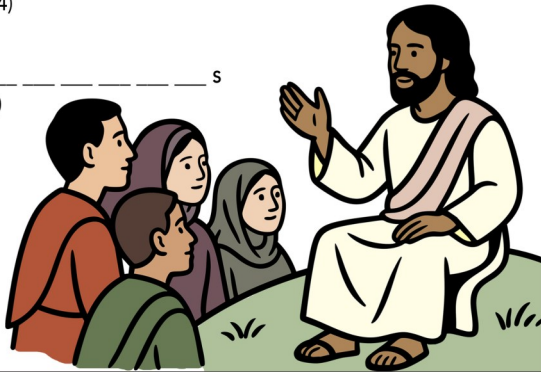

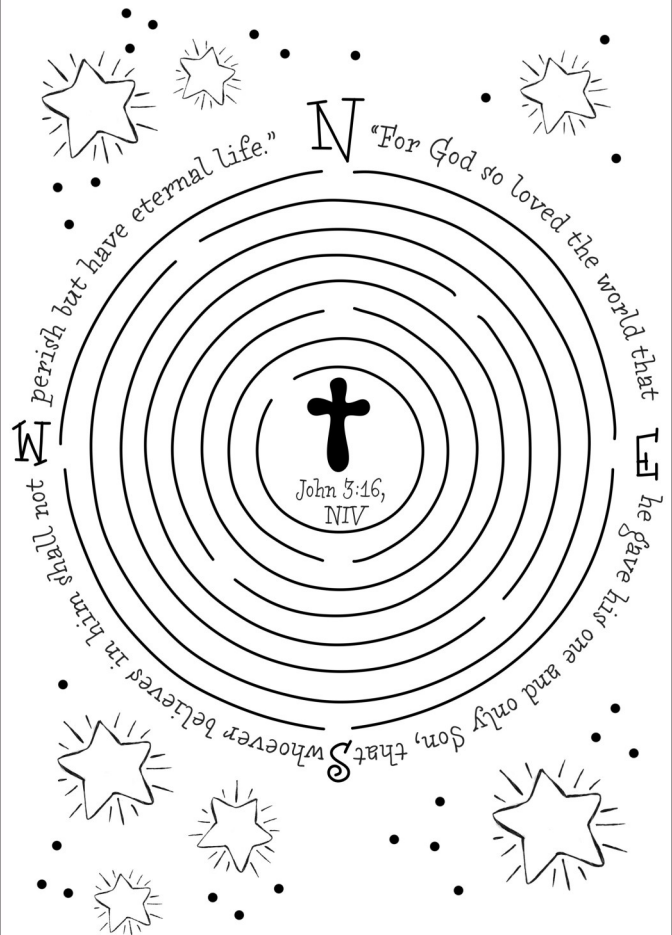
